



## Year 11

At St Bernard's Catholic High School we believe strongly in the importance of ensuring that our students leave school empowered to make a full and active contribution to society. It is essential that all of our students are able to make informed decisions about their futures through the provision of high quality and impartial careers information, advice and guidance (CIAG). We want to inspire our students about their futures and help raise their aspirations by ensuring that they are aware of the wide range of careers open to them and how to successfully progress into their chosen field of interest.

In order to achieve this, our careers programme has been devised to allow students to develop the personal qualities, skills and knowledge necessary to be successful in the world of work in line with the 8 Gatsby Benchmarks. The Gatsby Benchmarks are identified within the Government's statutory guidance and are internationally recognised as best practice of careers guidance.

Our careers programme is delivered throughout Year 7 -11 and appropriate support and guidance is provided by the need of the individual and the stage of their education. The delivery of our careers programme is enhanced and supported by a range of local FE providers, HE institutions (including universities) and employers. This is facilitated through assemblies, presentations, guest speakers, enterprise activities, enrichment days and visits.

In order to measure the impact and effectiveness of our careers programme we regularly seek feedback from our students, parents, providers and teachers in the form of questionnaires. This is an ongoing process throughout the year and is used to modify and review the programme as necessary. Post 16 destination data is also an integral part of our review process.

Through our careers programme all students will be provided with a Unifrog subscription. Students can use the site to research training and education opportunities along with managing online applications. It is a one stop shop for students to help inform and plan their future choices. The programme of study for Year 11 is outlined below:

### **Autumn:**

#### **Careers Interviews**

All students will receive an individual careers guidance interview with Ian Killip (Skills and Development Advisor – INSPIRA). This will result in an individual careers plan being produced to help students inform and plan their next step.

#### **Local Labour Market**



Enrichment day focused on the local labour market to inform students of the range of opportunities within the local area. This is further supported by participation in a CV and completing application forms workshop to ensure that students are fully prepared in taking their next steps towards achieving their goals and aspirations.

### Careers Fair

Students prepare for the school careers fair by discussing first impressions and how to make the most of these opportunities. The careers fair attracts over 30 FE, HE and local employers from a range of employment sectors.

### Post 16 Pathways Assemblies/ Presentations.

Programme of assemblies from FE, training providers and local employers providing students with information regarding the options open to them on leaving school.

### Guest Speakers

Programme of guest speakers from a range of employment sectors. Students are invited to attend based on their careers interests as highlighted in their careers questionnaire at the beginning of the Year.

### Spring:

During the Spring Term programme of assemblies and guest speakers will continue. Support and guidance will also continue with the completion of application forms.

### Mock Interviews

Students will participate in a mock interview facilitated and supported by a range of local employers, FE and training providers. This provides students with the opportunity to enhance their inter personal and communication skills in preparation for upcoming interviews for college and apprenticeship places.


### Summer:
